GREEN TEAM GOLF in SUN CITY WEST

Green Team Golf is a Developmental & Educational Golf Program

Green Team Golf is designed for golfers of varied experience and skill levels from the beginner golfer to the returning golfer.

You may come as a solo, a couple, or bring your own foursome; share a golf cart or walk the course. You do not need to maintain or establish a handicap.

Green Team's Mission Statement

To provide playing and instructional opportunities at little or no cost for new and existing golfers to learn, grow and play in a fun, safe and comfortable environment.

Green Team's 2.0 Program

For SCW residents to feel comfortable about their golfing experience. Green Team will start at the 25-yard tees and graduate through the 50 yard; 100 yard; and 150-yard tees checkpoints. Once the golfer successfully completes all the checkpoints, they are ready to play from the official tee box.

Cost

There are no dues or monitor fees. While members participate in Green Team's "2.0 Program," on a Green Team Saturday, the green fees are \$15.00 (Dec-Apr) and \$10.00 (May-Sept.)

PACE OF PLAY

THERE ARE THREE MAIN REASONS FOR SLOW PLAY:

1. COURSE RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- CART PATH ONLY ON CERTAIN HOLES.
- CARTS RESTRICTED FROM CERTAIN AREAS (DESERT, SLOPES, ETC.)
- ROPED OFF AREAS THAT DIRECT PLAYERS / CART TRAFFIC.

2. GOLF COURSE SET-UP:

- ROUGH IS TOO LONG.
- GREENS ARE TOO SLOW/FAST.
- HOLES ARE CUT IN VERY CHALLENGING POSITIONS.
- TEE MARKERS COULD BE IN DIFFERENT/CHALLENGING LOCATIONS.

PACE OF PLAY

3. GOLFER'S PLAYING HABITS:

- NOT READY TO PLAY WHEN IT IS THEIR TURN.
- PLAYER DRIVES CART PARTNER TO TEE SHOT AND WAITS UNTIL SHOT IS COMPLETE.
- PARK CARTS IN WRONG AREAS WRONG SIDE OF THE GREEN, ETC.
- TALKING WHEN GOLFERS SHOULD BE PLAYING SHOT.
- RECORDING SCORES ON GREEN OR AROUND GREEN
- LOOKING FOR BALLS OTHER THAN THEIR OWN.



PACE OF PLAY

AREAS WHERE ALL GOLFERS CAN IMPROVE:

- BE PREPARED TO PLAY STARTING BEFORE GETTING TO THE 1ST TEE BOX.
- PLAY "READY" GOLF.
- USE YOUR CART TO "HELP" WITH PACE OF PLAY NOT TO HURT IT.
- PLAY A PROVISIONAL BALL IF YOU THINK BALL IS LOST OR OUT OF BOUNDS.
- USE CONTINUOUS PUTTING WHEN / WHERE POSSIBLE.
- WRITE DOWN SCORES AT NEXT TEE BOX.
- BE AWARE OF WHERE YOUR GROUP IS IN RELATION TO GROUP AHEAD OF YOU...NOT BEHIND YOU.

PURPOSE OF PLAYERS ASSISTANT PROGRAM

- TO MAKE THE ROUND OF GOLF MORE ENJOYABLE FOR <u>ALL</u> PLAYERS.
- TO HELP WITH ON COURSE EMERGENCIES.
- **■** ENCOURAGE GOLFERS TO:
 - BE AWARE OF AND TO DO THEIR PART IN, KEEPING A REASONABLE PACE OF PLAY
 - ENFORCE COURSE RULES
 - HELP WITH COURSE MAINTENANCE
- TO BE THE EYES AND EARS OF THE GOLF SHOP.

So... What is the Answer?

Educate the Golfer – Pace of Play is the **Golfers** Responsibility

- Look forward not backwards in determining Pace of Play
- Unless you are the 2nd or 3rd group off in the AM, the two-some ahead of your foursome is still a viable tool to measure Pace of Play.
- Encourage each player in the group to do what they can to keep up with the group ahead / on time.
- PA's are there to look after **ALL** golfers not just a select few.

Set Expectations for the Golfer – Pace of Play Charts and utilizing Player Assistants

Understand that EVERY day brings new challenges – Mobility and Ability can wreak havoc if left unchecked.


The PA's goal is not to ruin anyone's day...but the PA is trained to not let a slow group(s) ruin everyone else's day!
